Time Signature	This shows how many beats are in each Bar
Compound Time	6/8 and 9/8. There are dotted notes in each Bar
Dominant 7th	Chord with a 7 th note (Dominant 7 th Chord would include C E G B)
Loop	Section of Music that repeats
Bar Lines	Lines that separates individual Bars
Imitation	A Musical idea repeated in another instrument or vocal part



What are the key characteristics of a Waltz?

A paired dance with couples close, arms around and facing each other. This was popular in Vienna and became a fashionable ballroom dance.



- Simple triple metre (3/4 time signature)
- Emphasis on the first beat of the bar
- Homophonic texture (Melody and accompaniment)
- Slow harmonic rhythm using primary chords (I, IV & V).
- Performed by the Orchestra in particular Strings

What is a Jig?

Traditional Folk dances from Ireland include intricate footwork and arms by sides.

- Reel
- Compound time (6/8)
- Simple time (2/4 or 4/4)
- "Two in a bar" feel
- Continuous bouncy quavers or semiquaver rhythms
- Fast tempo
- Binary form
- Folk instruments include Violin, Flute, Tin whistle, Accordion, Bodhran and Harp.

What are the roots of Disco Music?

Disco Music appeared in the 1970's as an individual, improvised dance in clubs from a mix of jazz, funk and soul.

- Simple quadruple metre (4/4)
- Fast tempo
- Simple chord patterns using chords I and V.
- Popular song form with a strong groove (long repeated rhythm section)
- Fade out endings, and catchy Riffs
- Guitars, vocals, drums, string/brass sounds, synthesisers, samples.

How does Club Dance Music appear in a range of styles?

Dance Music is influenced by Music Technology; Samplers, Synthesizers, Sequencers and Drum Machines. Dance Music is used within genres such as; House, Techno, Drum and Bass, Garage, Trance and Ambient.

- Simple quadruple metre (4/4).
- Use of electronic sounds.
- Strong beat emphasised by the drum and strong bass lines.
- Short phrases and repetitive sections.
- Fast tempo
- Complex, layered drum patterns.
